Homebound status: Due to diagnosis of Pleural Effusion Not Elsewhere Classified , the patient is experiencing decreased endurance and mobility, increasing the likelihood of falls. To safely leave their home, the patient needs assistance from another person and an assistive mobility device.																		
Clinical Condition Requiring Homecare: <div>The patient is an 83-year-old female admitted to home health services following a recent short-term acute care hospitalization for decompensated volume overload related to cirrhosis. Her past medical history is significant for vascular dementia, coronary atherosclerosis, atrial fibrillation managed with apixaban, type 2 diabetes mellitus, chronic kidney disease status post right nephrectomy, cirrhosis, congestive heart failure, anemia, bipolar disorder, major depressive disorder, prior right hip fracture, and prior right ankle fracture. She resides in an apartment attached to her son's home and has a 24/7 private in-home health aide who assists with activities of daily living as needed. On admission <mh class="chrome-extension-FindManyStrings chrome-extension-FindManyStrings-style-8 CE-FMS-assessment">assessment</mh>, the patient was alert and oriented to person, place, and time, intermittently oriented to situation (x3-4), and denied pain or shortness of breath. She ambulates with a rollator and currently requires skilled nursing, physical therapy, and occupational therapy services. Physical <mh class="chrome-extension-FindManyStrings chrome-extension-FindManyStrings-style-8 CE-FMS-assessment">assessment</mh> revealed bilateral lower extremity trace to +1 edema with several scabbed-over sores, expiratory wheezing noted on lung auscultation, positive bowel sounds, and palpable pulses in all four extremities. The patient's height is 5'5" and weight is 153 lbs; she is weighed daily by the aide. The patient and her son-in-law reported a recent increase in weight over the past several days, as well as worsening bilateral lower extremity edema since returning home. The son-in-law plans to discuss the recent weight gain with the cardiologist. The patient reports difficulty with elimination, stating she must manually stimulate herself to initiate urination, though she denies pain, burning, or urgency. Additionally, both the patient and aide report that she requires manual rectal stimulation to have a bowel movement; her last bowel movement was yesterday. A physical therapy evaluation was completed, noting that prior to hospitalization the patient ambulated with supervision using a rollator. Currently, she demonstrates decreased bilateral lower extremity strength (3/5 MMT), requires contact guard assistance for transfers and short-distance ambulation with a rolling walker, and is limited by generalized weakness, shortness of breath, and severe insomnia, at times reporting no sleep at all. Skilled physical therapy is indicated to improve strength, balance, safety, and functional mobility in order to facilitate a return to her prior level of function. An occupational therapy evaluation determined that the patient presents with deficits in activities of daily living, functional activity tolerance, functional mobility, and safety. She would benefit from skilled occupational therapy services one time per week for four weeks to address ADL training, adaptive equipment training, functional mobility training, and therapeutic exercises.
