Homebound status: Due to diagnosis of Hemiplegia following cerebral infarction affecting left non-dominant side, the patient is experiencing decreased endurance and mobility, increasing the likelihood of falls. To safely leave their home, the patient needs assistance from another person and an assistive mobility device.					
Clinical Condition Requiring Homecare: <p class="MsoNoSpacing">The patient is a 64-year-old male recently discharged on 3/25/26 from a 30-day skilled rehabilitation stay following a right frontal parasagittal stroke, with a past medical history significant for hypertension, hyperlipidemia, prediabetes, and lumbar radiculopathy. He presents with left-sided hemiparesis, including significant left lower extremity weakness (quadriceps 3-/5, poor ankle control, rigidity) and left upper extremity weakness (3/5 with intention tremor), resulting in impaired coordination, altered gait with left foot drag, and the need for moderate assistance for ambulation with a walker for short household distances (20-30 feet). He primarily uses a wheelchair for mobility but practices sit-to-stand exercises with supervision from family members, who are actively involved and supportive in his care. Transfers require contact guard to moderate assistance, and he demonstrates fair static standing balance and poor dynamic balance. The patient requires minimal to contact guard assistance for dressing and toileting and performs bathing at the sink, with weekly shower use. He denies any swallowing difficulties, and no skin breakdown or home safety hazards were observed during assessment. The patient is homebound due to decreased endurance and high fall risk. He has expressed interest in home health aide services 2-3 times per week and is motivated to begin physical therapy.
