Homebound status: After undergoing Left Total Hip Arthroplasty, the patient is experiencing decreased endurance and mobility, increasing the likelihood of falls. To safely leave their home, the patient needs assistance from another person and an assistive mobility device.					
Clinical Condition Requiring Homecare: <div>Start of care (SOC) physical therapy <mh class="chrome-extension-FindManyStrings chrome-extension-FindManyStrings-style-8 CE-FMS-assessment">assessment</mh> was completed for a 63-year-old male status post left total hip arthroplasty (L THA) performed approximately one week prior. Prior to surgery, the patient was independent with ambulation without an assistive device, with occasional use of a single-point cane. Following surgery, the patient initially reported good progress and was ambulating within his apartment using a rolling walker. However, the patient reports that on Saturday, while attempting to stand from a seated position on the couch, his left leg rotated inward, after which he became unable to stand or bear weight. On <mh class="chrome-extension-FindManyStrings chrome-extension-FindManyStrings-style-8 CE-FMS-assessment">assessment</mh>, the patient presents with significant functional decline, including markedly decreased strength in the left lower extremity, with manual muscle testing (MMT) graded at approximately 2-/5, limited by pain and adherence to hip precautions. The patient requires minimal assistance to transition from supine to sitting but is unable to perform sit-to-stand transfers or ambulate at this time. The presentation raises concern for possible postoperative complication. Given the acute change in functional status and inability to bear weight, the physical therapist contacted Dr. Apostolo, who advised immediate evaluation at the nearest emergency department. Emergency medical services (911) were activated, and the patient was safely transferred to the hospital via paramedics for further medical <mh class="chrome-extension-FindManyStrings chrome-extension-FindManyStrings-style-8 CE-FMS-assessment">assessment</mh> and management.
