Homebound status: Due to diagnosis of Hypothyroidism unspecified, the patient is experiencing decreased endurance and mobility, increasing the likelihood of falls. To safely leave their home, the patient needs assistance from another person and an assistive mobility device.					
Clinical Condition Requiring Homecare: Physical therapy evaluation was completed for this 70-year-old female with a complex medical history significant for lithium toxicity in January 2026 resulting in myxedema coma, atrial fibrillation, Graves' disease status post iodine therapy with subsequent iodine-induced severe hypothyroidism, bipolar disorder, and retinopathy of prematurity with retinal detachment status post scleral buckle procedure. The patient was recently hospitalized for symptomatic bradycardia, dizziness, failure to thrive, and abnormal thyroid function studies. Upon admission, the patient's heart rate was noted to be in the 40s, with laboratory findings revealing a TSH of 0.015 and elevated free T4 of 2.7 while receiving thyroid replacement therapy. The patient also reports an unintentional weight loss of approximately 70 pounds over the past two years. Prior to hospitalization, she experienced progressive dizziness and increasing difficulty with ambulation, which she associates with the initiation of lithium therapy, although she is unable to recall the exact start date of the medication. At the time of evaluation, the patient demonstrates significant lower extremity weakness with manual muscle testing revealing bilateral lower extremity strength of approximately 3-/5. Functional assessment indicates the patient requires contact guard assistance for transfers and short-distance ambulation without an assistive device. Impairments in strength, balance, and functional mobility place the patient at increased risk for falls and limit her safety and independence with daily activities. Skilled physical therapy services were initiated, including instruction in a home exercise program consisting of seated bilateral lower extremity therapeutic exercises. The patient was able to demonstrate understanding and proper performance of the prescribed exercises following instruction. Education was provided regarding the importance of regular participation in the home exercise program, fall prevention strategies, and safety awareness during mobility tasks. The patient would benefit from ongoing skilled physical therapy intervention to improve lower extremity strength, balance, endurance, and overall functional mobility, with the goal of maximizing safety and independence, reducing fall risk, and facilitating a return to her prior level of function. The plan of care includes progressive therapeutic exercise, gait training, transfer training, balance activities, patient education, and continued assessment of functional status and response to treatment.
