Homebound status: Due to diagnosis of Fracture of unspecified part of neck of right femur, subsequent encounter for closed fracture with routine healing, the patient is experiencing decreased endurance and mobility, increasing the likelihood of falls. To safely leave their home, the patient needs assistance from another person and an assistive mobility device.					
Clinical Condition Requiring Homecare: <div>The patient is an 88-year-old male with a significant past medical history of hypertension, prostate cancer currently on antineoplastic therapy, atrial fibrillation status post pacemaker placement, chronic anemia/thrombocytopenia, and history of falls. The patient recently sustained a right femoral neck fracture following a fall at home and was subsequently transported to the emergency room, where imaging confirmed the fracture. He underwent surgical repair with percutaneous pinning followed by a rehabilitation stay at a subacute rehab facility. The patient has since returned home and continues to require skilled home health services due to ongoing weakness, impaired mobility, balance deficits, and decline in functional independence. The patient is alert and oriented x4, though he occasionally requires words to be repeated secondary to hearing loss. Comprehensive physical assessment was completed, revealing lungs clear to auscultation, active bowel sounds in all quadrants, warm and intact skin, and a healed surgical incision with a small residual scar noted to the right hip region. The patient denies pain, shortness of breath, dizziness, headache, nausea, or vomiting at this time. He resides with his wife in a single-family home, while his two daughters and their families live in separate homes located within the same family compound, providing additional support as needed. The patient ambulates with the assistance of a rolling walker and currently remains on toe-touch weight-bearing restriction to the right lower extremity. Skilled physical therapy evaluation findings indicate bilateral lower extremity weakness, impaired balance, decreased endurance, altered gait mechanics, and dependence on a rolling walker for mobility. Functional deficits are negatively impacting bed mobility, transfers, household ambulation, and overall safety with mobility tasks, placing the patient at increased risk for falls and potential rehospitalization. Skilled home health physical therapy is medically necessary to address lower extremity strengthening, gait training, balance retraining, transfer training, safety awareness, fall prevention strategies, and progression of functional mobility in order to maximize independence and restore prior level of function. Additionally, the patient was evaluated for skilled occupational therapy services following hospitalization and subacute rehabilitation related to the femur fracture. Prior to hospitalization, the patient was independent with basic self-care tasks, functional transfers, and household ambulation utilizing a rolling walker. At present, the patient demonstrates decreased standing balance, reduced standing tolerance, diminished bilateral upper extremity strength, and decreased activity tolerance, resulting in impaired ability to safely and independently complete self-care activities, functional transfers, and functional ambulation. Skilled occupational therapy services are recommended to address deficits impacting activities of daily living, improve strength and endurance, enhance safety and independence within the home environment, and facilitate return to prior level of functioning. Education was provided regarding fall precautions, safe use of assistive devices, mobility safety, and adherence to weight-bearing restrictions.
