Clinical Condition Requiring Homecare:		<p class="16" align="justify" style="text-align:justify;text-justify:inter-ideograph;">The patient was admitted to home health services following hospitalization after a mechanical fall on 7/6 that resulted in an acute nondisplaced right lateral patellar facet fracture and severe anemia (hemoglobin 5.7 g/dL), requiring transfusion of two units of packed red blood cells. Past medical history is significant for hypertension, hyperlipidemia, coronary artery disease, thoracoabdominal aortic aneurysm, chronic kidney disease stage 3, gastroesophageal reflux disease, primary open-angle glaucoma, history of thrombus with embolism, anemia, and recurrent falls. The patient lives alone in an elevator-accessible senior apartment, with family and friends providing assistance as needed; however, clutter within the home limits safe walker navigation. On assessment, the patient was alert and oriented 3, denied pain and shortness of breath, had clear lung sounds, reported a good appetite and a bowel movement the previous day, and was wearing a right knee immobilizer while ambulating with a rolling walker under supervision for approximately 30 feet. Bed mobility and transfers to the bed, chair, and toilet also required supervision. Medication reconciliation was completed, and the patient reported recent changes to antihypertensive medications; skilled nursing will continue to monitor medication effectiveness and adherence. The patient was instructed to wear the right knee immobilizer at all times, tolerated a five-repetition home exercise program, and demonstrated understanding of all education provided. The patient is homebound due to the considerable effort required to leave the home with an assistive device and an increased fall risk, as evidenced by a Tinetti Balance and Gait Assessment score of 14/28. Occupational therapy evaluation identified deficits in standing balance, standing tolerance, upper extremity strength, activity tolerance, and independence with self-care and functional mobility compared to the patient's prior level of function. Continued skilled nursing, physical therapy, and occupational therapy are medically necessary to provide medication management, monitor recovery, improve strength, balance, mobility, and safety, reduce fall risk, and
